January 22 – Musical performance: Sarasota Opera: Highlights by Sarasota Opera's Finest Singers

Principal artists from the Sarasota Opera will perform opera highlights, including arias and ensembles, from some of
the most well-known and well-loved classic operas. Entering its 66th season, this special performance will showcase
the world-class talent this historical venue brings to the community. Sarasota Opera will present four classics this
season, including the Cavalleria Rusticana/Pagliacci, The Barber of Seville, The Marriage of Figaro, and Stiffelio.



January 29 – Musical performance: **Tom Purviance, piano: Mozart, Schoenberg and Rachmaninoff – From Simplicty to Extravagance**

Tom Purviance has performed as far west as the Hawaiian Islands where he played concerts for the 200th birthdays of Chopin and Liszt, and as far east as Tres, Croatia where he was featured in a solo concert. Since moving to Sarasota in the summer of 2015, he has become established as one of the finest and most active planists in the area as a

 $teacher, \, performer, \, collaborative \, pianist, \, author \, and \, lecturer.$



February 5 – Musical performance: **Gail Berenson, piano, Sylvia Eckes, piano, Jeff Sebeika, flute: The Art and Joys of Collaborative Performance**

Collaborative performing is one of the most rewarding types of music making. The inspiration and spontaneity of the performance is so dependent upon the interaction of the players, whether one plays duets at the piano or performs with other instrumentalists and vocalists. A greater and deeper musical experience results from the sum of their individual ideas. Today two pianists and a flutist will be sharing their special approaches used in preparing this program of wide-ranging styles.

February 12 – Lecture: Cavalleria Rusticana and Pagliacci--A Matched Pair, Joy McIntyre



February 19 – Music: Scott Kluksdahl, cello, Grigorios Zamparas, piano, 'Late Beethoven and Nordic Fire' Beethoven's fourth and fifth cello sonatas were composed simultaneously and were the only works he composed in 1815. Edvard Grieg composed his Cello Sonata in 1882. It is one of only five chamber works composed by the Norwegian master. Cellist Scott Kluksdahl has performed for nearly four decades as chamber musician, recitalist and soloist in the United States, Europe, Israel, and The Americas. Pianist Grigorios Zamparas has received critical acclaim for his versatile performing career as recitalist, orchestra soloist and chamber musician. US. Newport Daily News called him "...sensational!

March 5 -- Musical performance: **Giuseppina Ciarla, harp, Jesse Martins, piano: A Ticket Home** Italian born Giuseppina Ciarla, the principal harpist of The Sarasota Opera, is a classical musician and a groundbreaking crossover performer combining her artistry of voice and harp in an eclectic mélange ranging from jazz to sophisticated pop. Her authentic approach is rooted in classical training with vision to see new possibilities for popular classics as well as original compositions.

Ms. Bond has composed eight operas, six ballets, two piano concertos and orchestral, chamber, choral and keyboard compositions.
